

Editorial Standards

Submission of manuscripts to the Canadian Journal of Exploration Geophysics (CJEG) is invited in all areas of exploration geophysics.

Case histories related to Canadian exploration are particularly welcome. The submission and publication of CJEG papers is in electronic format. Papers received by the Editor will be deemed the property of the Canadian Society of Exploration Geophysicists (CSEG), unless the release of the paper is granted by the Editor. There are no page charges for CJEG papers. The CJEG will be available free of charge to all CSEG members via the CSEG web site www.cseg.ca.

Given that the CSEG is a section of the SEG, the CJEG adopts as its editorial standard the "Instructions to Authors" of the Society of Exploration Geophysicists (SEG), as published in *GEOPHYSICS* 76 (No. 1, 1JF), unless otherwise noted in this document.

Format and Submission of Manuscripts

Authors are invited to submit manuscripts in MS Word format to the present Editors, L.R. Lines or Satinder Chopra, whose e-mail addresses are lrines@ucalgary.ca or schopra@arcis.com

Organization of Manuscript

1. Title page gives the paper's title, author(s) names, addresses and affiliations. This page should note if the paper was given orally at a meeting.
2. The Abstract is a summary of the paper, giving the principal conclusions. Every paper, except for short notes, should have an abstract. Abstracts should be less than 300 words in length.
3. Papers should generally have headings for the **Introduction**, **Methodology**, **Results**, **Conclusions**, **References** and **Acknowledgements**.

4. Figures should be numbered sequentially and referenced in the text. Each figure should be clearly labelled with a clarifying caption. Separate high resolution .tif or .jpeg files at 300dpi for each figure should be submitted for each manuscript, once it has been accepted for publication.
5. References should comply with the formatting standard set for SEG's Journal, *GEOPHYSICS*, as noted above.

Units

Units should be expressed in SI units, as noted in the *Encyclopedic Dictionary of Exploration Geophysics*, authored by R.E. Sheriff (SEG Publication).

Spelling

Spelling should generally conform to official Canadian SI spelling. Acceptable alternatives would be spelling that conforms to SEG publication format. Regardless of chosen format, authors should be consistent with their spelling throughout an article.

The copyright for the Canadian Journal of Exploration Geophysics is reserved by the Canadian Society of Exploration Geophysicists (CSEG). Permission for reproduction of articles or images published in the CJEG needs to be taken in writing from the CSEG.
